

What can I expect for my child in KS2?

Homework - One of the main changes in Y6 is pupils having both Numeracy and Literacy every night from Monday to Thursday.


Pupils will further develop their problem-solving skills, looking for ways to overcome difficulties.

These children are chosen after GL Test scores have been analysed by the class teachers, Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator and Learning Support Teacher.
